

RULES FOR BRANDIS PRIZE FUND
REVISED RULES OF THE BRANDIS PRIZE FUND
(Effective from 1st January, 2017)

- 1- The Brandis Memorial Trust Prize fund was formed from part of the subscription made by the officer of the forest department as a testimonial to Sir Dietrich Brandis, K.C.I.E. when he retired in 1884.
- 2- The fund will continue to be operated by the Editor in consultation with Director, Forest Research Institute, Dehradun, who is also Chief Editor, Central Editorial Board of the *Indian Forester*.
- 3- The annual permanent income of the fund is to be utilized for the expenditure of awards of prizes to the professional foresters from India, who make original contribution to the *Indian Forester* on the theory and /or practice of silviculture and kindred subject
- 4- Two annual prizes will, therefore, be given as follows:-
 - (a) A certificate as a mark of honour will be given for the best original contribution on any subject connected with the theory and/or practice of Indian Silviculture.
 - (b) A certificate as mark of honour will be given for the best original contribution on any subject akin to Silviculture.
- 5- Preference will normally be given to contribution on silviculture subject, observation recorded in forest work, description of forest tracts, forest management etc.
- 6- Contribution of less than one printed page of the *Indian Forester* or more than 30 pages, will not usually be considered.
- 7- If in any year, no contribution is considered worthy of a prize, none need be awarded.
- 8- The award will be decided each year by the panel of judge appointed by the Chief Editor, Central Editorial Board for contribution printed in the *Indian Forester* during the previous year. This decision once announced will be final and published in the *Indian Forester*.
